 - a. Teachers met with the Ministry for negotiations this week. There is another day scheduled next Wednesday. Principals have a day scheduled next Tuesday. We are continuing to push for a new and decent offer from the Ministry. We will keep you informed about this next week.

 - e. Many of us are angry that progress has been so slow. Negotiations do take time, but it has been more than two weeks since the strike and we are still in negotiations.
 - f. **Have your say on what action we take next:**
 - g. Many of you will be wondering what should we do next.
 - h. We want your feedback on what should happen next:
 - Talk with your colleagues and worksite rep about what we can do next. Your worksite rep can [give feedback on Loomio](#), the weekly video conference and to their field staff.
 - [Feedback on Loomio](#) in the new discussion we have started.
 - i. **Take action now:**
 - Get in touch with your MP to let them know about how the crisis is affecting your school and to ask them to support a new decent offer being made to teachers and principals.
 - j. **Treasury said WHAT?! Why education was poorly funded in the Budget**

- k. In documents released last week, it was revealed that in the lead up to the Budget in May, Minister of Education Chris Hipkins asked for:
- \$5.5bn of operating funding for education against an allowance of \$2.6bn; and
 - \$9.7bn in capital funding against an allowance of \$2bn.
- l. **But the Treasury suggested the Government scale back funding increases for children with additional learning needs, and advised that increases to funding forearly childhood services and schools were not a priority because there was no evidence they could not cope.**
