Introduction to RTLit:

Serves 29 schools. Raewyn has worked in Papakura previously as a teacher. Now based at Papakura Normal. The RTLit Management Committee endorsed a proposal made by the RTLit, Raewyn Kurth. The Committee suggested that our RTLit table the proposal at both the Papakura Principals' and Hunua Principals' Associations.

Proposal to consider: the use the indirect model of intervention. Teachers are selected and come to RTLit as a group for PD on a fortnightly basis. They go back to their schools and Raewyn works 1-1 with the teachers in their schools. This programme is a yearlong commitment and is based on building on teacher capability. There is no charge. This model would be put in place for 2025.

Discussion was held. A lot of change in education at present. Is it possible to trial this for a set period? Rosehill Intermediate School is very keen to be a pilot school.

## 8) Iwi Engagement

Carly has talked with [Monique Henry](#) and about local Iwi representation at the Papakura Principals' Association table. Ngāti Tamaoho, Monique, would like it acknowledged that she is of equal standing to the group and paid accordingly.

Clarification was sought as to the intent of the role of Monique at our table was - engagement of our local iwi while giving her an opportunity to speak to the group as a whole. Discussion was held about:
